BOB SENGE: REQUESTED THAT THE HOA ASK FOR MORE VOLUNTEERS FOR HOA SOCIAL EVENTS AND COMMITTEES.

MIKE LOWENSTEIN: (COMMITTE CHAIR OF HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE AND CERT TEAM). HE SPOKE TO THE MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE CERT TEAM NEED FOR SNOWBIRDS TO CONTACT COVE AND INSURE THEY HAVE THEIR CONTACT INFORMATION IN CASE OF EMERGENCY FROM STORMS AND HURICANES, COVE CAN RELAY THIS INFORMATION TO THE CERT TEAM FOR THEIR HELP.

COVE HAS A SPECIAL FORM FOR THIS ISSUE AT THE FRONT OFFICE.

THERE IS A CONCERN IN THE COMMUNITY OVER INDENTIFING SPECIAL NEEDS PERSONS, DURING EMERGENCIES AND WEATHER EVENTS SHOULD EVACUATION BE NECESSARY. HE ALSO THANKED THE VOLUNTEER FIREMAND CLUB FOR THEIR DONATION. A RESERE ACCOUNT WAS SET UP TO TRACK THEIR FUNDING.

HE ALSO BROUGHT AN ISSUE THAT THE FMO IDENTIFIED: THE STATE OF FLORIDS COULD TAKE OVER HOMES VACATED WHEN THE OWNER MOVES TO A NURSING HOME, HE LET US KNOW THAT THERE IS A FORM AVAILABLE "DECLARATION OF DOMICILE," THAT NEEDS TO BE FILLED OUT AND FILED WITH THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT AND COMPTROLLER OF MARION COUNTY TP PREVENT THIS FROM HAPPENING. 




